<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>3</sup> - As to PW-02500v1, the original PW gross amount of Damages documented in the [07/26/2012] FEMA Form 90-91 was \$79,692.46, which is in excess of the DR-4031 Large Project threshhold amount of \$63,900.00, which would entitle the Applicant to reimbursement of its DAC. However, FEMA applied "Previous Disaster Insurance Purchase Requirements" (PDIPR) as to the East Scrubber Building and the Chlorination Building in the net amount of \$27,233.00, to reduce the PW net amount of Damages to \$52,459.46, which is less than the Large Project threshhold. NYS-DHSES and FEMA processed PW-02500 as a Small Project, so no final closeout audit was conducted. As a result, \$5,678.00 in DAC for Consultant Services has <u>not</u> yet been submitted as a claim for reimbursement because no Large Project Final Inspection Audit/closeout was conducted. Condition 5 of the FEMA Form 90-91 affirms that Applicant Joint Sewage Board has requested reimbursement of DAC, which is to be reconciled at closeout. However, Consultant Howard Weaver strongly recommends that any action to address recovery of DAC with respect to PW-02500 await close-out of pending PW-02501 in order not to delay their closeout processing by the limited FEMA and NYS-DHSES personnel assigned to remaining DR-4031 (Remnants of 09/07-11/2011 Tropical Storm Lee) PWs.
